COMMISSION WANTS TO HEAR FROM OREGONIANS ABOUT THEIR TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICE

The Oregon Public Utility Commission (PUC) has launched a survey to learn what Oregon residents think of available telecommunications services. Residential telephone and cellular service customers are encouraged to take this survey to provide input about the quality of service received and whether there is access to appropriate telecommunications services for individuals and communities to thrive.

The survey is intended to provide a voice to Oregon residents using telephone and cell services. The results will help inform a report that is due to the Oregon State Legislature as part of our investigation required by House Bill 3065, which passed in the 2019 Legislative session. This bill directed the PUC to establish a public process to investigate the continuing relevance of the "carrier of last resort" or COLR obligation on the state's telecommunications providers given the recent changes in technology and policy in the industry. The COLR obligation requires telephone companies to provide access to telephone service in their designated service territory without discrimination.

Census information we have been asked to share with our families -

Hello:

My name is Larry Scruggs and I am a Recruiting Assistant for the 2020 Census based in Salem. My current assignment is to do two things: (1) to recruit people to work on the 2020 census after the Covid-19 quarantine is lifted, and (2) to encourage people to self respond to the census.

The census is still hiring people to serve as enumerators to contact those who have not responded to the census. The pay is \$18/hr is the work is part time, lasting as long as the census work continues. To apply people can go online to 2020census.gov/jobs, or phone the census recruiting line at 503-385-0622. These are ideal jobs for teachers and staff because they are part-time, short-term jobs with good pay, flexible hours, and are in the local area.

We also need to encourage people in Tillamook County to turn in their census forms. As of today the response rate for Tillamook County is 32.9%. As I am sure you are aware, the population count the census will provide is used for everything from school support to the number of representatives Oregon will have in congress.
