#### **Senior Project**

CTE: Career Technical Education (focused on delivering hands-on, skills-based education)

- CTE programs focus on in demand occupations across a variety of career pathways. At Neah-Kah-Nie, we offer Construction Trades, Business and Natural Resources. These programs prepare students for a wide range of high-wage, high-skill in demand careers. Many of our class offerings include opportunity for college credit and provide students an early start in their postsecondary plans.
- What students should be interested in participating in CTE programs? This question can be answered by our business CTE teacher, Mrs. Beckwith. She says, "I feel everyone should take at least two classes in different CTE program offerings. Many times students in one program, like say construction, need to take a class in another program, like Business, because they want to own their own construction business. CTE programs can work together to get students some training to start them on the right path to their career goal." Just by participating in these programs you are increasing your potential to be successful in the career you choose.
- We all know stereotypes can be harmful but which are specifically tied to CTE learning?

- Mr. Albrectsen voices, "It's a boys only club' is the stereotype that is wrong. It's a whole new way of working in the world that involves skills, critical thinking, and wellness to keep learning. It's not about brute strength, it's about having a thoughtful state of mind and the opportunity to not be looking into a monitor all the time." This is important to note because many can be led astray from their preferences due to presumptions made from others.
- In this school you can learn many things from your CTE teachers. Mr. Gernert shared, "I really enjoy watching students develop new skills. Engaged students will always find something they can work to improve. One of the great things about being a carpenter is that you can always learn something new. A carpenter's work has a lot of variety which keeps it interesting. It also saves you a gym membership."
- CTE it's a great opportunity for students to take advantage of!
- Students who concentrate in a CTE pathway (6 or more classes) are more likely to graduate high school, get noticed by employers, are better prepared for their future careers and are likely to increase their earning potential by 45%. Those are some great benefits!



### College & Career Updates!

Neah-Kah-Nie's College and Career team took our high schoolers on two field trips in January. On January 24th, eleven students visited the Chemeketa Community College's campus in Salem. They learned about the different programs Chemeketa offers, the financial aid Chemeketa has available, toured the campus, and ate on-site at the cafeteria. On January 31st, 27 students visited the Portland State campus. They were able to ask questions of current students in different programs, learn about the programs and financial aid available, tour the campus, and eat on-site at the cafeteria.

Next month, we have four more trips lined up: TBCC on 2/1, Job Corps on 2/13, Linfield University on 2/14, and U of O on 2/28. And many more to come! Parents, keep an eye out for permission forms coming home with your students!


Robotics Bootcamp is coming up on February 12th-15th. We are looking for students interested in learning if Robotics is for them! We will meet after school those four days from 3:45-6:00PM. We do have limited slots for participants - and will notify parents and students by February 7th if they are chosen to attend (based on the applications we receive by the deadline!) Robotics is a club for 7th-12th grade students - these students compete in <u>FIRST Tech Challenge</u>, an International Robotics competition. In teams of 6-10 they will design, build, and program a robot to compete in a game that changes each year. The season starts the second Saturday of September, and continues through Winter, typically finishing by the middle of February or March. We have 4 league meets in the Fall (on Saturdays) culminating in a Qualifying Tournament in early February which will determine which teams will continue to the State Competition.

NKN has several competitive teams and meets two days a week after school during the season. If students participate in other sports - we ask that they dedicate time each week for Robotics. It can be hard to do everything well - so we ask that those students that choose to participate in multiple activities be prepared to give Robotics dedicated time and attention.
