
# NES Family Painting Night March 14th, 5:30-6:30 p.m.

Greetings!

February we celebrated kindness! Our K- 3rd graders learned about filling someone's bucket! What can they do daily to make someone feel valued and cared for. While our 4th and 5th graders learned about the science of kindness and how showing random

acts of kindness can improve both your mental and physical health! All grades committed to carrying out random acts of kindness throughout the month of February.

March is all about bully prevention. Students will learn to recognize, refuse and report bullying. It is important for students to know the difference between bullying, and a mean moment or a conflict with another student. Bullying is taken very seriously and all students need to learn to recognize the signs.

Every year Nehalem Elementary administers the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) to 2nd and 5th grade students. This assessment helps us in determining if a student qualifies for Neah-Kah-Nie's Talented and Gifted program (TAG). We will be testing the 2nd grade students March 13, 14 & 15 and the 5th grade students March 19, 20 & 21 . Each testing window is an hour or less. Mindfulness (another way to describe it to younger kids - being where your feet are) will continue to be incorporated into our SEL lessons this year. Practicing mindfulness is a great way to train

our brains to regain focus and calm. and be "present" in the moment (without judgment), whether it

be in the classroom, at lunch, at recess or at home with family. I encourage you to practice this with your students at home. The more they practice, the more automatic a mindfulness response becomes. MindYeti is a great resource for PreK - 3rd grade. It was created by the Committee for Children who is the creator of Second Step, the SEL curriculum used at NES. Waterford.orgis another great resource for kids and mindfulness as well.

Hello NES families, do you need youth after school care, please reach out to us here at NCRD. We pick up your students at Nehalem Elementary school at the end of each school day and are open until 5pm. The cost is \$6 per day per child. This does include a nutritious snack and a host of enrichment activities (outdoor play/walks, gym time, crafts, music, science, etc.) We offer full-day childcare on non- school days but are closed on all Federal holidays. No school days are \$20 per student with preregistration. March has 6 no school days that we are providing care for. The first is Friday, March 8, followed by all of spring break March 25 - 29. 
