Title I-A Program

- What is “Title I-A”?
 - A component of ESEA, our nation’s largest education assistance program for schools
 - Provides additional support to students with the greatest need
 - Can support behavioral and social emotional needs as well as academic needs

All ESEA programs, including Title I-A, are about ensuring the right supports get to the right students

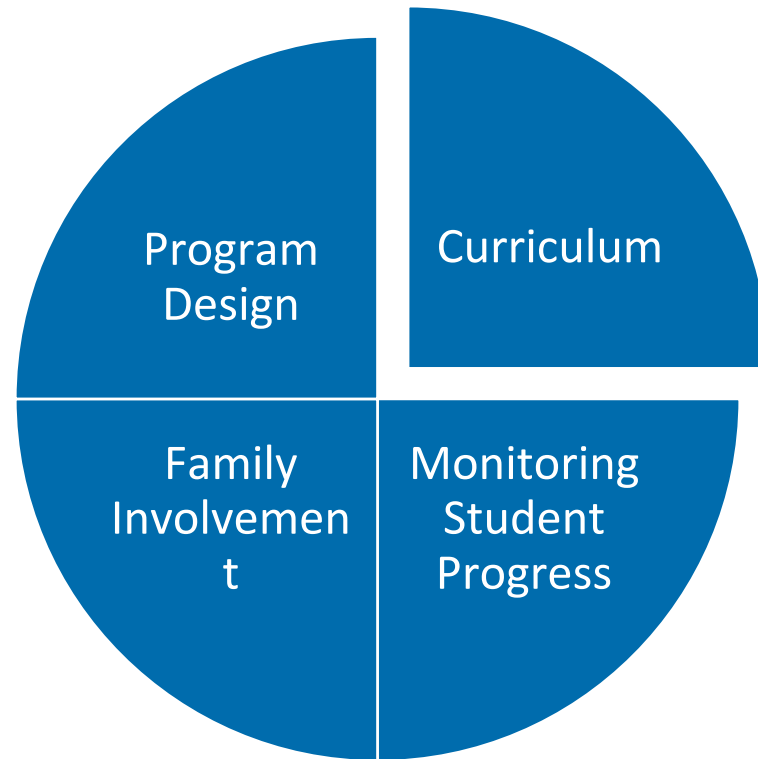
Each Title I-A school must...

- Complete an annual needs assessment
- Create and annually update a school-level plan and compact
- Develop and implement a Family Engagement Plan
- Engage families as partners in their child's learning
- Maintain documentation of staff qualifications

Parent/Guardian Rights Under ESSA

- Right to request educator qualifications
- Request opportunities to meet with staff
- Participate in decisions affecting your child
- Review school's Title I program and make suggestions
- Participate in school activities

Title I-A Program Components



Our School's Program

Our school's model

- NES has a schoolwide model, meaning all students benefit from our Title I-A program.

What does our program look like?

- NES employs full time instructional assistants to assist teachers with classroom instruction. These instructional assistants help in core classes (reading, writing, math) in grades K-5 and also teach reading and math interventions to small groups of students.

Our Goals

1. Improve learning in reading for all students based on fall and spring student assessments.
 2. Improve learning in math for all students based on fall and spring student assessments.
 3. Pilot a new math curriculum to improve learning for all students. This spring will end a two year, two curriculum pilot with the goal being to choose one of the two curriculums to adopt for Fall 2025.
- In our school, families are involved in the process of establishing the goals by giving input to our site council on school issues via annual family surveys and reviewing pilot curriculums during adoption cycles.

Our School's Curriculum

CORE CURRICULUMS:

- MATH: Last year GGS and NES piloted the new edition of Ready Math all year. This year both elementaries are piloting Illustrative Math 360 all year. We will check in multiple times a year to see how things are going and which curriculum we are preferring then decide on one to adopt for Fall 2025
- ART: Art Attack
- ELA: Wit and Wisdom, Foundations, Heggerty K/1 only
- SOCIAL STUDIES: Into Social Studies
- SCIENCE: Mystery Science
- HEALTH: The Great Body Shop- Taught through PE classes

INTERVENTION CURRICULUMS:

- MATH: Bridges, Do the Math
- ELA: Phonics for Reading, Reading Mastery, Dyslexia Toolkit

How We Monitor Student Progress

Assessments our school uses

- K/1: ESGI for Reading and Math, DIBELS for Reading
- Grade 2-5: DIBELS for Reading, iReady for Math

Progress monitoring process

- We progress monitor learning using in-curriculum assessments, DIBELS assessments, writing prompts, ESGI assessments, etc. depending on the child's needs.

Communication of your child's progress

- We have family and teacher conferences 2x per school year- fall and spring
- Teachers send home report cards at the end of each trimester.

Our Data-How are we doing? (Better than most!)

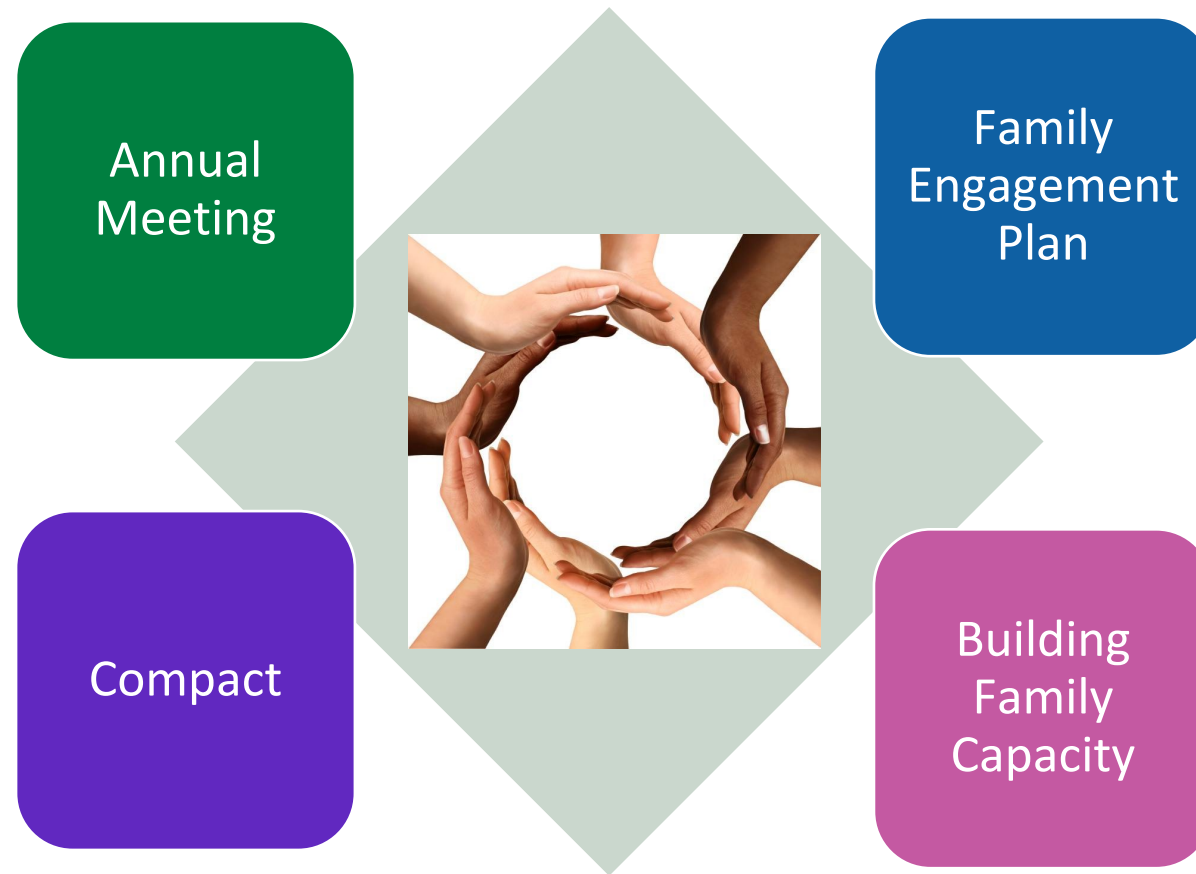
