November Characteristic is Responsibility



Each month, GGS focuses on a personal characteristic and teaches it to our students. Our focus for the month of November is responsibility. Students who demonstrate being responsible are responsible for their actions and words. They clean up after themselves, keep trying and always try their best. They think before they act and consider the consequences.

At the end of the month we will be handing out three awards in each class, two for students who were demonstrating Being Responsible, and one Pride of the Pack award focused on perseverance. Please talk with your child(ren) around the conversations they are having at school on being responsible.

Every Day Matters and We're Here to Help!

Students miss school for many reasons. Some are related to transportation or basic needs, and others are connected to emotional or academic challenges. No matter what the reason, it's important to address the root cause before a student falls behind. GGS wants your child to succeed and is focused on helping smooth the way to regular attendance.

Ms. H's Counseling Corner

This month my classroom social skills lessons have been focusing on using our Tools to be safe. The three Tools that we learned about this month include our Words Tool, Personal Space Tool, and Garbage Can Tool. By using Wise Wolf Way #2, we first determine the size of the problem, and then match our reaction to the size of the problem. We talked about how the small problems can trick our brain because of the strong emotions we might be feeling. This strong emotion makes small problems feel like a big problem. This is where we use our Breathing Tool to give us a 3 to 5 second pause to help us respond instead of react. Here are some questions that we used to help guide us when trying to figure out the size of our problem.



If you can answer yes to these questions you have a small problem:

- Can you solve the problem by yourself? Can you use your tools to fix the problem? Can you fix the problem in less than 5 minutes?

If you can answer yes to these questions you have a medium problem.

- Will it take some effort to fix this problem? Can you fix the problem by the end of the day or tomorrow? Do you need an adult to help you with an action plan?

If you can answer yes to these questions you have a big problem.

- Are you in danger or feeling terrible pain? Is anyone else in danger or feeling terrible pain? Does this problem scare you or make you feel uncomfortable?

Garbage Can Tool - "I let the little things go."

We have learned that we carry our imaginary garbage can with us and we can use it whenever we need to throw out small irritations. We don't need to react to the negative words and actions of others. We just put them in our garbage can and move on. However, some behaviors are not possible to walk away from and we need to get help from an adult when we have a big problem.



Personal Space Tool- "I have the right to my space and so do you." With the introduction of our personal space tool, we talked about understanding our body boundary and the importance of respecting others boundaries as well. Our personal space can change depending on who we are with and our location. If someone is too close we can let them know by using our Words Tool. We practiced several different ways to use our words to let people know they are in our space.

Words Tool - "I use the right words, in the right way, at the right time and for the right reason." We have been practicing using our words tool to "talk to our brain," and to talk to others in a strong respectful voice. By using this tool, we can use our positive self-talk to help us remain calm, and to let people know how we are feeling to help us solve our problems.

The monthly characteristic for **November** is Responsibility, and we will be focusing on three new Tools to help the students understand and put this into practice. Being responsible is the ability to make good choices, be dependable, and take accountability for our actions. It also means understanding how choices we make impact others, the world, and ourselves. With that in mind, students will learn more about our Empathy and Courage Tools, and with Thanksgiving quickly approaching, we will also work on our Please and Thank You Tool, to give thanks and show appreciation!

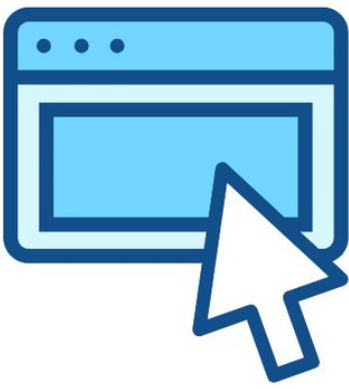
Sign up for FlashAlert!

PLEASE KEEP STUDENTS WITH SYMPTOMS OUT OF SCHOOL

This list is school instructions, not medical advice. Please contact your health care provider with health concerns.

SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS	THE STUDENT MAY RETURN AFTER... *The list below tells the shortest time to stay home. A student may need to stay home longer for some illnesses.
 Fever: temperature of 100.4°F (38°C) or greater	* Fever-free for 24 hours without taking fever-reducing medicine.
 New cough illness	* Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no cough or cough is well-controlled).
 New difficulty breathing	* Symptoms improving for 24 hours (breathing comfortably). <i>Urgent medical care may be needed.</i>
 Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery stools in a day OR not able to control bowel movements	* Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no more than two bowel movements more than normal and no longer having accidents) OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.
 Vomiting: one or more episode that is unexplained	* Symptom-free for 24 hours OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.
 Headache with stiff neck and fever	* Symptom-free OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. Follow fever instructions above. <i>Urgent medical care may be needed.</i>
Skin rash or open sores	* Symptom free , which means rash is gone OR sores are dry or can be completely covered by a bandage OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.
Red eyes with colored drainage	* Symptom-free , which means redness and drainage are gone OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.
Jaundice: new yellow color in eyes or skin	* After the school has orders from doctor or local public health authority to school nurse.
Acting differently without a reason: unusually sleepy, grumpy, or confused.	* Symptom-free , which means return to normal behavior OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.
Major health event, like an illness lasting 2 or more weeks OR a hospital stay, OR health condition requires more care than school staff can safely provide.	* After the school has orders from doctor to school nurse AND after measures are in place for the student's safety. Please work with school staff to address special health-care needs so the student may attend safely.

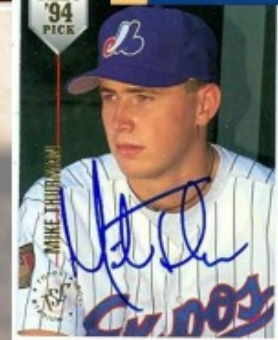
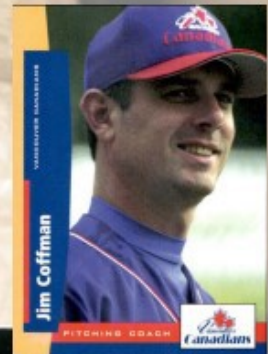
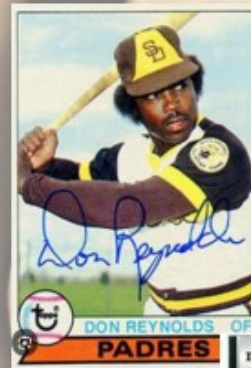
