ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

We need your help! Keep your teen on track in Middle & High School.



- Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- Chronic absence is defined as 18 days a year—or just 2 days a month even if those absences are excused!
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.

We are not always by our phone, so by emailing us it will help keep your student's attendance up to date!

with you to make sure your student is as successful as possible. Students with strong attendance are more likely to succeed in school and in future employment. All absences impact a student's performance and they miss out on valuable instructional time. Emailing or calling the office to let us know they won't be here is a start to keeping them on track!

Outdoor School Camp is a required part of the 6th grade curriculum.



Yondr: Frequently Asked Questions

• What if I want to reach my child during the school day?

Our priority is for our students to engage in their learning. If you need to contact your child during the school day, contact the main office at **503-355-2990**, **or** you may email your student at their school email address.

What if there is a school emergency?

Keeping our students safe, responding quickly, and providing accurate information are our top priorities. In case of a school emergency, we will direct our students to safety first following our school emergency preparedness protocol and will disseminate accurate information to all families using the communication tools at our disposal.

Will my student's phone be safe?

Students will retain possession of their phone - in their Yondr pouch - for the entire school day. We will advise students to store the pouch in their backpacks where it is completely safe.

What devices will my student have access to for their academic needs?

Students can use Chromebooks in each of their classrooms, and checkout to take home if needed.

• Will students have their phones at lunch?

Our building will remain "phone-free" for the academic day. The expectation is all students will be phone-free while in our building.

• What if I need to check my student out for an appointment?

Please call the main office at 503-355-2990 and let our office staff know when your student should be dismissed. Our staff will communicate that with your student, and they will be able to check out in the main office and unlock their pouch as they exit.

Will students have access to their phones on buses to and from school and during extracurricular activities?

Yes, students will not be required to lock their phones away until entering the building in the mornings. We also acknowledge that many students need to communicate with adults about events after school. Students will be able to unlock their phones at the end of the academic day.

• What if a student is caught on their phone?

The Yondr pouch is the property of the Neah-Kah-Nie School District and will be checked out to each student just like a textbook or Chromebook and each student will be responsible for its condition. If a student damages their Pouch or is found on their phone, school staff will collect the phone/Pouch and contact home:

- 1. First Offense: Device is delivered to the main office. Student may pick up their device at the end of the day. Parents will be notified via phone or email. Students will be retaught expectations
- 2. Second Offense: Device is delivered to the main office. Parent will be contacted and may be required to pick up the device at the end of the day. Student will be retaught expectations Disciplinary action may be administered.
- 3. Third Offense: Device is delivered to the main office. Parent will be required to pick up the device from school. Administration, student and parents will create a technology use plan. Disciplinary action may be administered.


What if the Yondr pouch gets damaged?

The Yondr pouch is the property of the Neah-Kah-Nie School District and will be checked out to each student just like a textbook or Chromebook, and each student will be responsible for its condition. If a student damages their Pouch, a \$30 fee will be assessed for the replacement of the Pouch.

Medications at School

If your student requires medication at school, they <u>must</u> be checked in with the Middle School office by the parent or guardian. No medications can be checked in to our office without completed paperwork.



- A permission form must be submitted to the office for medication administration
- This means: All medication must be checked in at the office with a signed authorization from a parent or physician depending on the medication.
- This applies TO ALL MEDICATION EVEN TUMS OR ASPRIN.
